

## Board of Education Calls for December Vote

The Eufaula Board of Education, in conjunction with an overwhelming majority of teachers and support staff, have planned a district-wide vote in a joint effort to improve school facilities. "We are in desperate need of these facilities," says the new superintendent of schools. "The facts are plain, and the need is evident to those of us who walk the hallways and visit the classrooms. There is no more time left to argue about whether or not our school district is in need of major improvements. The fire marshal and OSHA have made that determination for us. The voters in the district have two choices. They can vote in support of the bond proposal and get on with the task of educating our children, or let apathy and mistrust dictate the future of our school and suffer those consequences. We are asking them to become educated voters. Call us for the facts. Facts we back with state reports and school law. Read the local newspaper, visit our school facilities, ask your children. I am confident the patrons in this community will agree, Improvement is Long Overdue."

#### **Board Sets Plan for School Improvement**

The Eufaula Board of Education, on advice from Superintendent Wilson, has approved a five year school improvement plan based on the anticipated voter approval of a December bond election. With proceeds from the bond election, and the 3.4 million dollars the school board has saved over the past ten years, Superintendent Wilson believes the following improvement of school facilities is possible. Wilson has stated with the passage of the Dec. bond election, and a continuation of a frugal school management style, the board can affect a positive change in school facilities for all students in the district by the end of July, 2005.

## Innovative Programs Supported by Federal Funding

The district's Federal Programs Director, Bea Baker, has received three federal grants roughly totaling \$750,000. The district received a Title III Grant, providing computers for all three elementary computer labs; A Goals 2000 Technology Grant, providing training and software assistance for the sites; and a 21st Century Grant, providing two computers for each elementary classroom and financial support for the very popular After School Program for students in grades K-9. Carol Conatser, project coordinator for the 21st Century grant, has organized an exciting program with over three hundred and eighty five students enrolled. After the school day ends, the students enjoy a healthy snack prepared for them by our district's school cafeteria cooks. From there, students have time to complete their homework assignments before choosing an After School activity. Activities include a variety of arts and crafts projects, physical activities, and participation in the Accelerated Reader program.

### Good Ole' Days Return to Houston Homan Jr. High

Houston Homan Jr. High School recently averted a near tragedy. Old wiring carrying 230 volts of electricity developed a direct short that could have sparked a tragic fire. Only through the quick actions of maintenance personnel and the building principal, Chris Whelan, was the situation resolved with no one being injured. The direct short in the electrical wiring left Houston Homan without air conditioning for several days. Students at Houston Homan experienced what schooling was like 'in the good 'ole days.' Classes continued to meet in rooms with temperatures exceeding the 90's. It is unfortunate that those conditions are not uncommon for many of our students and faculty members throughout the district's aging facilities.
