ith the December bond approval for new construction, the Eufaula Board of Education and Superintendent, Bill Wilson, are busy ensuring all necessary steps are taken in preparation to begin construction on the new elementary school building:

December: Bond Proposal passes for new construction

January: Board approved final schematic drawings of

new elementary

February: Board approved final contract documents

March: Board opened and tabulated construction bids
April: Board will award contract to begin construction

Companies bidding on the construction project were as follows:

Ameri Group \$3,413,000 Jim Butler Construction \$3,681,927

The Ross Group \$3,832,378 \$3,762,800 Vista Construction, Inc.

The lowest bid was submitted by Ameri Group, and was \$587,000 under the projected budget. This savings will provide funding for the completion of the High School classroom construction.

ELEMENTARY HIGHLIGHTS

- All three elementary media centers are now fully automated. Students may browse the OPAC stations to search for Accelerated Reader books on their individual reading levels. The students may quickly find books by subject, title, or by their favorite author. Media Assistants Glenda Ray, Susan Wood, and Liz Steele along with media specialist, Robyn Burris, have worked hard this year learning the new circulation and catalog components, generating bibliographies for teachers, printing overdue reports, and in giving instruction to our students on how to use the automated system.
- Our Elementary Students have read books and have taken quizzes on a total of 16,466 Accelerated Reader books. So far this year, Dixie students have passed quizzes on 8,272 books, Jefferson Davis students passed quizzes on 7,051 books, and Cooper McClain students passed quizzes on 1,143 books.
- New Computers were placed in all elementary computer labs and every elementary classroom received two new computers. The computers are networked and students and teachers may access the Accelerated Reader program and the Library Media Center card catalog from their classrooms.

DIXIE HIGHLIGHTS: Congratulations to three Dixie students who won at the county level for "Don't Lay Your Trash on Oklahoma" poster contest: Dexter Nelson won 1st, Caleb Anderson won 2nd, and Daxton Powell won 3rd. Sherre Whittington is our district's elementary art teacher. Our students are introduced to a variety of art techniques and the excitement of creating art projects.

- Dixie Basketball Games were held April 6th from 11:30 to 3:15 in the EHS gym. The classes played each other. Portable goals were used, so the shots were within reach for the little ones. Parents were charged admission and the concession stand was open. If you have not experienced Dixie Basketball, plan on attending next year.
- Fun Day is scheduled for Friday, April 27th from 12:00 3:00 at the EHS football field. The concession stand will be open. The students participate in Ring Toss, Basketball Throw, Sack Race, Bean Bag Throw, Frisbee Toss, and Lots More Fun.
- End of the year Field Trips are scheduled for the spring including trips to Jasmine Moran Children's Museum, the Tulsa Zoo, and the Kirkpatrick Center in OKC.

JEFFERSON DAVIS HIGHLIGHTS: Kim Sanders, Eufaula's elementary music teacher, works tirelessly in introducing our students to music appreciation and the art of performing. Students at all elementary sites are given the opportunity to participate in Ms. Sanders' music program. Plan to attend "Golden Oldies" being performed in the High School auditorium April 20th at 1:30 P.M.

Cooper McClain Highlights: The final records for the 5th and 6th Grade Basketball season are worthy of praise from even our talented High School Ironhead Athletes! Emily Coppick, Elementary Basketball Coach, had an exceptional year with her four teams. The 5th Grade Girls were 10-1 winning the Quinton Tournament and coming in second at the Shrine Tournament. The 5th Grade Boys were 7-2 winning the Quinton Tournament. The 6th Grade Girls were *Undefeated* with a 17-0 record winning First Place in the Henryetta, Quinton, and Shrine Tournaments. The 6th Grade Boys were 16-2 winning the Quinton and Shrine Tournament and coming in second place at the Henryetta Tournament.



Somebody JUST TRY to tell Ironhead fans this wasn't an Exciting Year! The #1 ranked Boys Basketball Team made Ironhead History under the leadership of Coach Lamar Armstrong winning 2nd place in the State Championship Finals to end the season 22-3. The Top Ten ranked Ironhead Football team lead by Coach Kerry Roberts made it all the way to the State Championship Semi-Finals to end their season 12-2, Coach Kent Kiester's Academic Team took home the Class 3A Regional 8 Championship Trophy, the Ironhead Power Lifting Team, coached by Kerry Roberts, competed in the State Power Lifting Competition in McCloud taking 5th place with sixtynine teams competing. The Ironhead Band, under the direction of Mr. Jerry Toler, won their Second Class 2A State Championship. They received a Superior Rating in the District Concert in February which qualified them for the State Band Contest on the OSU campus later this month. On April 5th, the band students will visit San Antonio and participate in the Heritage Festival Band Contest.

Few school districts enjoy this kind of success. Fewer still are the number of school districts whose student body behaves with the kind of character and discipline shown by our students whether in victory or in defeat. The students have made us proud!
