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THANKS EUFAULA! BOND PASSES 1187-277

Eufaula voters overwhelmingly approved the school bond election of December 12, 2000. By a vote of 1187 to 277, district voters said "Yes" to the proposed construction of new school facilities. The majority of voters in each precinct supported the bond proposal with their vote. Proceeds from the sale of the school bonds will be used to finalize construction of a new elementary school and initiate a *Five Year Plan* which includes a new middle school campus and additional classrooms at the high school. Completion of the architectural design is underway, and construction is scheduled to begin March, 2001. *Heads Up* will keep you informed of construction progress.


