A s Eufaula band members tuned their instruments and last minute preparations were being made for the dedication of Eufaula's new elementary school, thunder began rumbling to the north and west. As guests began arriving, reports of heavy rain as near as Stidham to the west and the highway 69 bridge to the north raised the concern that the dedication may have to move indoors. But, the storms did not dampen the ceremony, nor could they have dampened the spirit of the day.

Opening this historic ceremony, Superintendent Bill Wilson introduced *The Pride of Eufaula* and their band director, Glen Sizemore. As guests stood while the band played, "*Oklahoma*" there were more than a few tears in the eyes of the audience from those who realized the significance and importance of what was about to take place.

Guests continued to stand while VFW members of Post 8798, and members of its Ladies Auxiliary, marched in formation to the podium where Commander Harold Haltom presented the American Flag to principals Linda Tharp and Jerry Farmer.

The American Flag was then presented to Boy Scouts Devon Oxford, Bill Kent IV, and Kevin Masters. As these scouts began to raise the flag, the band played our nation's anthem. As the flag unfurled above the new educational facility, the air of a new beginning could be felt along with that special pride that comes from a job well done.

The District's Board of Education whose dedication and commitment to improve Eufaula Schools has been the foundation for this new facility, were asked to stand as we recognized the members; Ms. Dian Dawson, Col. Harold Pinney, Dr. Mike Dew, Mr. Charles Perry, and Mr. Chuck Boss. Mike Owen of TAO contractors, Mike Scifres, Randy Peterson, Supt. Dan Edwards of Henryetta and Supt. Danny Williams of Stidham were among the special guests.

Mr. Bill Kaighn, the architect for the elementary building, was more than thrilled at seeing the completion of this construction project, as it has been almost a decade since he sketched the first rough draft. Mr. Kaighn made a special trip from Norman, OK, to attend the ceremony and to bring the updated schematic for display to show the public how the building will look in the future if further construction builds the district's new middle school facility.

Member and Past President, 2001, James Pratt of Eufaula Masonic Lodge # 1 offered our district the opportunity for the Masonic Grand Lodge of Guthrie, OK, to conduct the Corner Stone Ceremony to properly dedicate the new building.

Another very special guest was Randy Beebee, the construction superintendent, who managed the construction site hour-by-hour and day-by- day for the past two years. He and his team are truly professional craftsmen and were committed to having the building completed by the expected August deadline.

Mayor Bill Day and City Council Members Clarence Pierce, Don Wilkerson, Ruby Swadley, Dean Smith, Greg Anderson, Kenneth Willmon, Jannetta Carr, and Janet Bumgarner were special guests, as were County Commissioners, Bill Shackleford, J.D. Williams, and Glen Coleman. Without the joint effort of our city government and county government working hand-in-hand with school officials, the project would not have been ready for the opening day of school.

Canadian Valley Electric Cooperative CEO, George Hand, took the time to be a part of this historic day and was a special guest of the Board of Education. CVEC is in the process of replacing the wooden electric poles that line the highway in front of the new elementary building with new steel electric poles. CVEC provided the faculty and staff with a Back to School Barbecue Luncheon, and they have offered to host an *Elementary Student of the Month* this year.

As Superintendent Wilson introduced Congressman Brad Carson and Congressman J.C. Watts, he emphasized that it was through their effort in Washington, DC that our school district received \$250,000 in reclaimed federal money. He asked that as our guests tour the school building following the dedication ceremony, they find the time to thank the congressmen as the furniture and school supplies they will see are the direct result of their effort.

As the band played the OU fight song, former OU quarterback & Eufaula alumnus, Congressman J.C. Watts, made his way to the podium. Congressman Watts made a special effort to be a part of this historic day. Even with prior obligations, Congressman Watts made the time to be the keynote speaker and spent the entire day inside the school building visiting with friends and *enjoying the moment*.

Congressman Watts' address was directed specifically to our young people. "Our graduating seniors won't be competing simply against others seeking jobs in Eufaula, Oklahoma. They won't simply be competing against others seeking jobs in the State of Oklahoma, they won't even be competing in the job market on a national level. They will be competing for jobs in a global economy where applicants will be from every corner of the world." Watts stressed the importance for students, parents, teachers, and administrators to realize that education must be taken seriously if today's graduates are to be successful in providing for their families in this ever-changing and ever-challenging job market.

State Superintendent, Sandy Garrett, spoke briefly complementing the school system and the community for coming together and for providing needed facilities for our students. She emphasized that reading, writing, arithmetic, and computer skills are basic fundamental skills every student must have if they are to be successful, contributing citizens. As Superintendent Garrett left the platform, she proudly donned her newly acquired Ironhead Football Cap.

The Grand Commandry Knights Templar of Oklahoma, dressed in 18th century uniforms with plumed hats and bronze swords, majestically escorted Officers from the Grand Lodge of Guthrie, OK, to the platform where the officers performed the traditional Corner Stone Ceremony. The tradition, set by George Washington in laying the corner stone of our nation's capital, was followed step by step as officers played their part in this historic tradition. With their help, the building was dedicated and blessed in a grand way for the students for years to come. The lodge also provided a bronze time capsule that contained, among other items, a program and picture of the dedication. The capsule will not be opened for one hundred years.

As the ceremony came to a close, the guests moved to the doorway where special guests joined Superintendent Bill Wilson as he cut the ribbon and declared the building open to the public.

On display in the lobby and one of the first things to see upon entering the building was a collage of pictures illustrating the construction project in its many phases over the past two years from the first dozer work to the final construction - and setting just across from that display was the architect's schematic showing the facility as it will look with the addition of a new middle school.

So, Eufaula, our work is not over, and that is the way it should be in education. Vision without Action is merely a dream, Action without Vision is a Waste of Time, but Vision With Action Can Change the World, and that has been done in the lives of our students attending Eufaula Elementary School.

Bryce McKinney of Eufaula Flower Shoppe. donated the ribbon and bows for the ceremony. Nichols Food donated a Back to School Cake for the elementary faculty and staff. Geneva Farmer donated a beautiful plant for the office area of the new school, and Ruthie's on highway 9 west donated a decorated, antique student school desk for the lobby. THANK YOU!

## **Child Nutrition**

The *Horizon Software System* is being implemented into Eufaula Schools to manage the Child Nutrition Program for the high school, middle school, and elementary cafeterias. This software will process and manage the free and reduced program. It will generate state required reports and notices to parents concerning their child's lunch accounts. The software has the components for tracking inventory, central order bidding & processing, menu planning and nutrition analysis.

Automating the food service department will allow our site registrars a faster way to gather information and track student information, while providing parents an accurate record on the status of their child's lunch account.

- Lunches will not resume until the debt has been paid.

#### 8th, 9th and 10th grade students Could Earn Free College Tuition

The Oklahoma Legislature has set up a unique program for 8th, 9th, & 10th grade students that will help pay for their college education if their family's income is \$50,000 or less. The program is called the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program (OHLAP). By signing up for OHLAP, students may earn free college tuition by meeting a few, but essential, requirements such as taking the 17 unit core curriculum, maintaining a 2.5 grade point average and staying away from trouble like gangs, drugs, and alcohol. For students who fulfill the requirements, the state will pay their tuition at a public college or university or cover a portion of their tuition at a private institution. In addition, OHLAP may be used for select courses from public career-technology centers. Applications are available from school counselors, on the OHLAP Web site at www.okhighered.org/ohlap or call 1-800-858-1840.
