NINTH GRADE COMPLEX "The Big Dig"



The building contractor at the *ninth grade construction* site has received a favorable plasticity index test on the dirt work. This test measures the amount of moisture in the soil. The next step is to drill multiple

piers 18 inches in diameter to a depth of 12 to 25 feet or three feet into the weathered shale. When the piers have been completed and inspected by the architect and engineer, the contractor will proceed with pouring the grade beams and floor of the building. Superintendent Bill Wilson, and construction Superintendent, Randy Beebe are pleased with the progress being made at the new elementary school site.



#### **ELEMENTARY SITE:**

The building subcontractor has completed roofing the north and east wings of the elementary building, and even with the delay caused by a few days of cold and windy weather, the roofing project should be finalized by the first week of January. As the roofing project continues, the exterior walls

being laid. A gray split face block with four courses of a black accent block is being used. After the building exterior is completed, the dirt contractor has an additional eight

inches of topsoil to be placed around the building. This layer of top soil will eliminate

indiscriminate ponding of water near the building. While exterior construction continues, interior work has begun. The *Safe Rooms* are finished. These are restrooms designed to withstand a tornado. Two safe rooms are located on each of the three classroom wings. Interior classroom walls are being constructed with reinforcement to accommodate chalkboards and bulletin boards. Plumbing and HVAC contractors are busy at work in each of the classrooms, cafeteria, media center, and administrative offices.

## TAX STATEMENT REFLECTS PROMISES KEPT

During the 2000 school bond election campaign, voters were promised their cost would not exceed a 10% increase and the millage increase would be approximately 8 mills. The initial evaluation of a typical tax statement shown below indicates a school sinking fund of 7.7 mills. The statement reflects a sinking fund cost of \$3.16 which represents 9.6% of the total tax bill. If your property tax increased by more than 10%, contact the county assessor's office for additional information concerning your taxes.
