During the school year, the *National School Lunch Program* serves over 14 million free or reduced price meals on a given day. During the summer, that number drops to one million. The federally funded *Summer Food Service Program* wants you to *Take a Friend to Lunch* by providing FREE breakfast and lunch to anyone in the district from ages one to eighteen years of age. "Breakfast and Lunch will be provided this summer from June 03 -21 and July 08 -19th at Dixie. Breakfast will be served from 8:00 -9:00 and lunch will be served from 11:30 -1:00. We encourage *Everyone* to take part in this program. Adults may eat breakfast for \$1.05 and lunch for \$2.35 and their children may eat free. Additional cuts in state aid Superintendent were announced May 14th by the State Department of Education. In addition to the previously announced cut, an additional 16% cut for the final two months of fiscal year 02 were recently added. This will bring the total reduction in funding for Eufaula Schools to approximately \$200,000. While these cuts are devastating some area schools, Eufaula is expected to weather the budget crisis. It will require some tightening of our operation, but no immediate personnel cuts are expected. Eufaula has had a conservative operation in years past and because of this approach, we are well prepared for these difficult times. The loss of funding will impact our budgeting process. With the loss of funding constantly in mind, we will proceed with the completion of two new buildings currently under construction and begin planning for the dedication and ribbon cutting ceremony of the new elementary school in August. The ninth grade center is expected to be completed in September, one month behind schedule.
