# LIGHTS CAMERA ACTION!

Those traveling past Eufaula Elementary School in the early morning hours of April 13th & April 21st witnessed one of the first major steps of the elementary and middle school construction projects. The laborers and equipment began arriving at 3 o'clock A.M. First, portable lights and two generators were positioned to light the work area without obstructing the concrete trucks or finishing equipment. Next, the pump truck (photo top right)



was positioned to receive the concrete that would soon be arriving.



The architect and job superintendent were on site to inspect the vapor barrier and the proper installation of the steel reinforcing bars. Shortly, Foresee Ready Mix concrete trucks began arriving. The first concrete was poured into containers for the testing lab to check the temperature and potential strength of the concrete. With the approval of the testing lab and the architect, concrete began hitting the ground at 4:04 A.M. With over 300 yards of concrete to be poured, finished and sawed this day, a long day had begun.

Technology has so changed the face of construction since the construction of the Eufaula Elementary in 2000. With the pump truck placing the concrete in each corner of the 20,000 square foot slab, 15 laborers pushed the concrete into the path of a concrete leveling machine, which is controlled by lasers. After the operator calibrated the leveling machine to the lasers, the machine leveled the concrete to an unbelievable perfection. The leveling crew averages pouring and leveling 4000 square feet of concrete each hour.



There are areas of the slab where plumbing prevents the leveling machine from being used and the laborers must finish those areas by hand.

Five hours after the concrete began hitting the ground, the finishing crew began setting operator-mounted screening machines onto the slab.

With four and five finishing machines operating at the same time, the concrete began to take its finished form. Shortly after lunch, the crew began the arduous task of sawing the concrete to prevent cracking during the curing process. The day ended with 20,000 square feet of concrete ready for the steel



building erectors. This process must be repeated three more times.



This slab is the compilation of months of preparation for the concrete. First the dirt contractor had to build the school pads, which was tested by the testing lab for compaction. If the pad failed the compaction tests, the pads would have been removed and the process would have started all over again with 12 inch lifts of dirt compacted and tested before the next lift could be added. Thirty-six inch spread footing with reinforcing steel must be poured with the building anchor bolts installed in the footing in just the right places. No room for error. Then the plumbing and electrical must be roughed-in. Finally, concrete forms are ready to be set.

This was the second concrete slab to be poured. The first slab was poured for the elementary school addition being added to the east end of the existing elementary building. While concrete is being poured for the middle school, the steel building erector is busy installing the steel members of the elementary school addition. The elementary school is now roofed and the steel studs are being installed. Soon masons will be busy laying the exterior concrete block walls.

The elementary classrooms are planned to be finished in time for the 2006 fall term and full day kindergarten classes. The middle school classrooms are scheduled for opening in the fall of 2007-2008. The middle school gymnasium is projected for a later completion.

Our dream of new schools for all Eufaula students won't be realized without sacrifice. The construction process has been challenged by the escalating price of gasoline. Then, the gulf coast hurricanes caused a spike in the cost of building materials. Less committed individuals would have given up, but not the Eufaula School Board. We will proceed and someway, somehow, we will finish these projects.



What we are attempting to accomplish will take patience and understanding of the entire Eufaula school community. There will be unexpected delays and additional costs, but with a mutual understanding of these complex building projects, we will complete our schools and Eufaula's children will prosper because of our combined effort.

### Elementary Principal Rita Ford Announces Full Day Kindergarten Enrollment Dates

Pre-Enrollment for the first year of full day kindergarten was held on March 30. Anyone that did not attend this enrollment will need to contact the school to set up an appointment for a screening and to fill out enrollment papers. Enrollment dates for the 2006-07 school year will be as follows:

- K-2 Wednesday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>
- 3-5 Thursday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>

Birth certificate, social security card, immunization record, CDIB card, and proof of residency are required for new enrollees to the district. Anyone that pre-enrolled their kindergartner will NOT have to come the August 2<sup>nd</sup> date. If these dates won't work, parents may call the school any time this summer to see if someone is available to do enrollment for their children.
