Having anxieties about what might go wrong, the first day of operation in the newly built kitchen went flawlessly, thanks to Child Nutrition Director, Kim Smelser, and the organized cafeteria staff. The staff, in addition to serving breakfast and lunch in the elementary cafeteria, served 100 middle school students breakfast and 300 middle school students lunch.



Construction Update





With a 1600 square foot lobby overlooking two practice basketball courts, one competition court, and one volleyball court, the construction of the 18,000 square foot middle school gymnasium continues.

The sub-flooring and all six basketball goals have been installed. The hardwood floor has been delivered and must climatize in the gymnasium before installation. Once installed, the floor will be sanded, sealed, striped, and finished. The finish must dry for a week prior to the installation of the bleachers that will line both the east and west sides of the gymnasium.

The two practice courts will be used by the middle school PE students and for the elementary basketball program that will begin in the 2008-2009 school year. The competition basketball court will be used primarily for middle school basketball, however, the high school basketball program will use the court the last hour of each school day.

The gymnasium will also provide space for elementary and middle school programs and indoor events, and will be initiated this year in hosting the 2008 Kindergarten Graduation.
