

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Eufaula School District wishes to recognize the long and valued service of two long-time board members who resigned from the School Board this year. Both members served over ten years and were involved in the decisions that produced the changes that were needed to reshape and redirect the Eufaula School District.





These two members, Dr. Mike Dew and Mrs. Dian Dawson, are to be commended for their dedication to the Eufaula School District. With the help of fellow board members, Charles Perry, Margaret Dobbs, and Chuck Boss, and the direction of Superintendent Bill Wilson, Eufaula Schools experienced a period of unparalleled growth.

Their effort and the community's desire for change led to the construction of a new elementary and middle school, a ninth grade center, dramatic improvement in academics, and exemplary improvements in achievement test scores. While Dr. Dew and Mrs. Dawson's experience and leadership will be missed, two outstanding citizens have stepped forward to accept the challenges that face our school district. The new board members are Dr. Jeff Pippenger and Mrs. Shirley Breedlove and are both outstanding citi-



zens with close ties to Eufaula Schools. We are confident in their ability to carry on the good work.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Before I make the following report, I want to preface it by making the following caveat. The School Board and former superintendent Wilson did exactly what they should have done when all bond and building fund monies over the last eight to nine years were invested in the new elementary and middle schools. These projects were, by far, the most desperate and pressing needs of Eufaula Schools. However, during that time, and by necessity, little was invested in the athletic, vo-ag, high school band, or high school cafeteria facilities. I feel that we now need to continue to upgrade those facilities. I realize that classrooms are the most important investment for our students. However, much of the public's perception of the school comes through its observations at extracurricular events, i.e. vo-ag, sports, band, etc. Please keep these factors in mind while reading the following superintendent's report.

The new softball field is only partially complete. However, we are at a stage of construction where it can be completed relatively quickly. At present, the dirt work is mostly completed, the concrete stem walls have been constructed and the metal sides and roof on the dugouts have been installed. We are now ready to: install the plumbing for the players' restrooms — which will be located in each dugout, erect the metal bracing for the backstop netting, pour concrete floors in both dugouts and on the spectator seating areas, install the chain link fence around the outfield, install a wireless scoreboard, install a sprinkler system in the outfield, and erect and connect the light poles and lights. NOTE: The 50 foot poles have been delivered.

The high school gymnasium floor was in terrible shape before a water leak further damaged it last fall. After the water leak, the west end of the floor was almost unusable. In addition, the bleachers and public restrooms, lobby, and concession stand were in disrepair and becoming less and less functional. Complaints from the public were constant in regards to the condition of the restrooms. Therefore, based on these problems, the following steps have been taken. The old floor was removed at no cost to the district, and the new floor has been delivered. The bleachers have been taken out and are in the process of being cleaned, repaired, and will soon be painted and reinstalled, and the public restrooms and concession stand have been stripped down to the walls—and will be totally remodeled within the next six to eight weeks.


If funding allows, I would like to install lights at the baseball field in the near future. This year we were allowed to host a Regional Tournament due to our team being rated so highly. Checotah Schools was gracious enough to allow us to use their baseball field so that we could at least have an assimilation of a home field advantage. The Secondary Association did express misgivings about our using another school's facilities.

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLAR

Hector Longoria-Ortega was awarded a \$1,400 Savings Bond for winning the 2009 Downey Publishing Company Award for the McIntosh County Phone Book Cover Art Contest. Matt Helms and Halley Gilley were awarded \$500.00 for winning 2nd and 3rd place in the contest. Eighty seven Eufaula Students are enrolled in the OK Promise Program. Upon successfully completing the program, their college tuition will be paid at any OK State college or University.

The girls golf team led by Amy Aday, Dannah Whelan, Courtney Singleton, Jessica Gawf, & Lauren Belyeu





Contest season started Sept. 29th at SOSU's John Parnell Memorial Marching Contest in Durant where the band won 1st place in class 2A and 5th place overall. At the Konawa Band Daze Marching Contest on Oct. 4th they were awarded 1st place in Large Class 3A, Outstanding Drum Line, Outstanding Color Guard, High Music Score, and Outstanding Overall Class 3A. They moved on to OBA, which was held at Moore High School. Here they achieved 1st place 2A, High Music Score, High Visual Score, and High General Effect, which put them into the finals where they took home 2nd place Overall and were announced as the 2A State Champion Marching Band.
