FINANCIAL PICTURE FOR OKLAHOMA SCHOOLS - Dan, Edwards, Superintendent

As you know, the economy in Oklahoma is not good at this time. The unemployment rate is up and economic growth is nonexistent. These economic conditions have caused a hardship on everyone, and our public schools are no exception. Total revenue collections for the State this school year are down over 25% below the estimates on which this year's budgets were estimated. Cuts from the State have, depending on the purpose of the funding, varied from 5% to 19%. These cuts, depending on their size, will affect Eufaula Schools, as follows: a 5% cut in State Aid will constitute a \$227,500 loss in funding to our school; a 10% cut will create a \$455,000 shortfall; a 15% cut will cause a shortage of \$682,000; and a 20% cut would equal a loss in funding of \$910,000.

Another factor affecting schools' budgets is a rise in operational expenses, including employees' health insurance premiums. Eufaula School's portion of employee medical insurance premiums will increase the school's cost an additional \$43,110 for the remainder of this school year. Next year, even if the State does not increase insurance rates again, Eufaula Schools will have to come up with another \$74,665 just to meet Eufaula School's portion of the employees' health insurance premiums.

The administration and Board of Education of Eufaula Schools are going to make every effort to cut expenses in areas which will not affect the students' programs or classes. However, if the funding cuts are deep enough, educational programs may be affected.



Ciara Smelser - All-Regional Cheerleader

Ciara Smelser, the daughter of Kelly and Kim Smelser of Eufaula, is Eufaula High Schools first All-Regional Cheerleader. Ciara competed at Vertigras High School. There were 42 cheerleaders who tried out for the 16 slots. During the tryout, Ciara was judged on her cheer motions, her jumps, and her tumbling. Ciara has been a cheerleader for six years and has been named NCA All-American and UCA All-Star Cheerleader. She also traveled to Hawaii this past summer and participated in a week long cheerleader camp. Ciara plans to attend school at UCO next year, where she hopes to make the cheer squad so she can continue her love for cheering.

Undefeated Academic Team - Coaches Vicki Ridge and Keith Wood

We are pleased to announce that the Eufaula High School Varsity Academic Team remains *Undefeated* with a conference season of 27-0, and an overall record of 33-0. Congratulations go to senior team members Ashley Kapoor, Cody McGuire, Kolin Coats, and Shelby Franklin, as well as junior members Eric Breon, Aaron Edwards, Kristina Carrico, and freshman Tim Winner.

Two of the varsity members making the All-Conference team achieved All-Conference status based on questions answered per quarters played. The All-Conference members are Eric Breon, who was first overall, and Ashley Kapoor. In addition, three varsity members, Eric Breon, Ashley Kapoor, and Shelby Franklin traveled to Warner High School to compete in the first round of testing to qualify for

one of eight spots on *Team Oklahoma*. The top eight players from Team Oklahoma are then selected to compete nationally.

The team is now excited to move on to the area tournament on January 16, 2010, and anticipates attending the state tournament for a second consecutive year and the third time ever in the history of Eufaula High School The team believes that all the hours spent on buses traveling to and from their meets were worth it; and they hope to make our town and school proud this January.

High School Speech Contest Winners - EHS English Teacher, Gale Applegate

Three Eufaula High School juniors have received recognition for their expertise in writing and speaking from the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 8798 and it's Ladies' Auxiliary. Each year the post sponsors the *Voice of Democracy* speech contest to help students gain poise and self-confidence in expressing their views about America.

Wilo Stravlo, contest coordinator, announced the local winners at the Veteran's Day assembly at the high school. Daniel Salters placed first and was awarded \$300. Brettlyn Bevenue placed second and received \$250. Eric Breon placed third and was awarded \$150 for his efforts. Salters' and Bevenue's recorded speeches will advance to the district level of competition

EHS English teacher Gale Applegate uses the contest to introduce specific writing techniques to her students. "The large cash awards offered by the local VFW post make motivating my students to write much easier. They also benefit from exploring a patriotic topic," commented Applegate.

The contest generates over three million dollars annually in scholarships nationwide. *Does America Still Have Heroes* is the theme of this year's contest.

Eufaula Elementary News - Victor Salcedo, Principal

Eufaula Elementary School received the Title One Academic Achievement Award for the 2008-2009 school year. This award is given to schools for excellence in closing the gap between subgroups in reading. As a result EES received \$45,000 to be used for classroom resources to further improve academic achievement.

Eufaula Elementary School has successfully departmentalized the 5th grade classes for the 2009-2010 school year. Students are now changing classes each period similar to students at the middle school. This change will enable 5th students at EES to make a more successful transition to 6th grade at the middle school.

First grade teacher, Diana Goodwin has written and received several grants for use in the classroom. Mrs. Goodwin, a National Board Certified Teacher, recently received the *ING Unsung Heroes Grant*. This \$2,000 grant has allowed Mrs. Goodwin to establish a science lab, the *Know Zone*, to be used by all EES grades.

Mrs. Goodwin was one of only 100 people out of 2000 applicants in the United States to receive this grant. She also received the OG& E Energy Corporation Teacher Grant for \$1,000 to fund science materials and supplies for the school science lab. Only one of 35 Oklahoma teachers received this grant. Two other grants awarded to Mrs. Goodwin were the OERB Harlan Krumme Energy Education Grant for \$1,000 (\$500 for classroom materials and \$500 for personal use) and the \$800 Target Field Trip Grant, which provided funding for the entire first grade to attend a theatrical production of Pinocchio. Mrs. Goodwin is also in the process of writing a grant to promote citizenship and character in our school.

Students have had great success with two new computer software programs, *Study Island* and *Alpha Plus*, purchased by Eufaula Public Schools to enrich and encourage student learning. Students can access Study Island from home via the Internet. The elementary school also implemented the online grade book. This is a useful tool for parents to view progress online and encourages communication between the school and parents. Grades can be accessed from any location with Internet access.

In October, members of the middle school academic team traveled with the high school team to Buffalo Valley to compete in their first meet.

In November, a group of middle school students competed in a *Tournament of Champions* qualifier at Metro Christian Academy in Tulsa. These students, after putting in a hard day at school, traveled an hour and half to challenge themselves with a 100 questions tests in a variety of subjects.

The students, whose competition included large and private schools, scored well on the tests, and many placed in the top ten.

Eli Breon rose above his competitors, taking two first place medals in science and social studies. Students who placed first through third qualified to compete in the *Tournament of Champions*, which will be held in April in El Reno.

EHS Marching Band 2-A State Champions.. Again! Directors Glenn Sizemore and Michael Palmer

Another Great Season for the Eufaula High School Marching Band has come and gone. This season's accomplishments have continued to set the bar higher and have prolonged the great tradition of our Eufaula Band program. The students once again have worked deligently to carry on the torch and plan to take the momentum gained in marching band on into concert season. The marching season competition started in Morris at the Morris Invitational Marching Contest where the band received awards for Outstanding Drumline, 1st in class 3A, and 2nd overall in classes 2A-4A.

The Marching Band was awarded the High Music and High General Effect captions for their preliminary performance at the OBA State Marching Championships in Bixby. They were also awarded 1st in Class 2A making them the *Three-Time Consecutive 2A State Champion*, the *third year in a row t*hat Eufaula High School Marching Band has held that distinction. Their preliminary performance would also earn them a spot in the Finals competition that same evening competing against the top 12 bands in classes 1A through 3A. The overall standing after Finals would award Eufaula Marching Band with 2nd place overall in classes 1A through 3A! Their success continued at the Konawa Band Day Marching Contest where the band received awards for High Music, Outstanding Drumline, 1st in class Large 3A, and Outstanding Band in class 3A.

At the final competition at the OSSAA Regional Marching Contest competition the EPS band competed for a Divisional Rating. Ratings range 1, which is superior, through 5, which is poor. This is the first phase of a *Sweepstakes Award* given to high school bands in all classes that earn a Superior rating in marching and in concert band seasons. The three judges at the competition all agreed and each one awarded a Superior rating to the EHS Marching Band.
